
Authors' societies are the vital link between creators and the users of their works.

They manage the rights of their members and represent them in negotiations to secure fair remunerations.

They are run by their members, are non-profit, and provide a crucial service in the creative sector that enables authors to create, but also gives wider access to content for consumers, and facilitates licensing for users.


Here are some key figures on the activities of authors' societies in Europe in 2015

Together, GESAC member societies have over 1 million members




45,000 new members joined in 2015 alone


In 2015, authors' societies licensed over **3 million** users



for a repertoire that includes millions of works



In total, **€5 billion** in royalties were collected





and
over €4 billion
were distributed*

That's 82% of the collected amounts in 2015

^{*} Amounts not distributed mainly cover the management fee and royalties still in the pipeline to be distributed

€220 million were invested in the future of European culture through social and cultural funds

That's about 4% of collections and more than the EU's yearly culture budget

Social funds cover support like retirement funds, financial help in case of illness, etc.



Cultural funds support activities like talent development, festivals, concerts, recording sessions, etc.

Overall, collected royalties were distributed to some **550,000** creators

That means over half of GESAC societies' members had their works used

700 offices and 8,000 employees



Overall, in 2015, authors' societies had €780 million in costs

In fact, GESAC members

spent **€ 140 million**on IT costs alone

that's 18% of total costs



Investing in IT is key

• it enables authors' societies to accurately collect and distribute royalties by monitoring usage



UK's PRS for Music alone processed **2.5 trillion uses**in 2015

Germany's GEMA handled

500 terabytes of data

and expects a yearly

growth of minimum 20%

were registered, of which **70 000** online
